HEALTH DISPARITIES IN SOCIETY MINOR

Health disparities describe the disproportionate burden of disease, differential access to health care, and poorer health outcomes that affect minoritized populations. Health disparities can exist at multiple levels of society (global, national, institutional, local, and personal) and affect people of diverse geographic locations, linguistic groups, socioeconomic statuses, and sociocultural groups. Housed in the Department of Gender, Sexuality, and Women's Studies, the Health Disparities in Society (HDS) minor provides a framework to examine how multiple social inequalities (e.g., along class, gender, geography, race/ethnicity, sexuality) intersect to produce disparities in health and how to work toward preventing and mitigating such disparities.

Requirements

- · No more than three credits of independent study may count toward the minor.
- · Students must complete a minimum of six credits of coursework exclusive to the minor that cannot count toward the major(s) or other minors.

- Although students must complete WST 2322 before enrolling in WST 4941C, they may take the elective courses in any order at any time (i.e., before, during, or after taking the two required courses).
- Students are encouraged to indicate their intention to enroll in WST 4941C as soon as they commit to the minor, by completing this survey (https://ufl.qualtrics.com/jfe/form/SV_cHzSYoPAjclk7f8/).
- Sometimes, and with the approval of the undergraduate coordinator for Women's Studies, students may petition to have other, relevant courses approved as substitutes within each category of electives within the minor. Such courses could include department *special topics* offering with numbers like 3930, 4930.
